

The topper sailing started this year with the beginners course open to first years at the High School. Eight attended, 5 of whom are still sailing, and over the season they have progressed really well. As usual we had the 3 points series with about 5 toppers consistently attending them.

In July the Dinghy Regatta took place alongside the Laser Traveller with only 3 toppers participating – 1st Becky, 2nd Dawn, 3rd Robert – it was still competitive even with the 3 of us racing. But it was quite disappointing that no one else in the club's topper fleet wanted to race at the regatta.

In August Becky, Robert and I ventured into solings for an afternoon to sail in the Junior Helm. Becky sailed in 'Just Gonnie No' with Liz L and her mum, Robert sailed in 'Romance' with Hamish and his dad, and I sailed in 'Hussoiling' with Ian and my dad. It was a great afternoon and there was even sunshine. It started offcalm, but the wind picked up gradually causing some excitement going around the leeward mark. In the end Robert came 1st, Becky came 2nd and Dawn came 3rd.

To round off the season 3 toppers participated along side 6 other boats in the Closing Muster and Pursuit Race – Patrick, Jessie and Dawn. The race started of quite windy so Jessie and Patrick had to put in reefs. They both did really well keeping their boats up and not capsizing and also managing to sail a larger course than they are used to. The final results were Dawn 6th, Jessie and Patrick 7th.

Overall it has been a great season here for the topper fleet. Well done to all the topper sailors who have won races and participated in the club's events. Hopefully we will have another great season next year.
