
A Winter's Telltale January 2004

A Sideways look at the beginners'course

A new adult's Basic Skills Course will start after Easter beginning with 2 weekends. This will give participants a chance to build on skills on Thursdays throughout the summer. Thanks to Brian and Hamish in advance. Tell your friends - speaking from last year's experience - the more people involved the better the course.

There is of course a lot of new terms to learn, and so to ease the process here are some terms commonly used by either Hamish or Brian. I never wrote these down so some of the spelling may be wrong.

A tack - Something to shout when a speed boat goes by

A gybe - Something said to let you know that you should know better

Port - Something to help remember sailing in the Summer Starboard - The list of Commodores just inside the club house

Buoy - Anybody younger than the instructors (includes women)

Main sheet - The most troublesome member of the class Capsize drill - Doing things to stop your hat blowing off

Running - A good thing to learn

Flooding tide - Noticeable by the strong current going left to right past the slipway Ebbing tide -Noticeable by the probable strong current going left to right past the slipway

Keelboat- A boat with only 4 essentials to worry about

Keelboat 5th essential The amount of water between the keel and the seabed

Dinghy - A proper boat

Changes to Points Series recording and Dinghy sailor league

We thought we would try something new this year. Anybody who has a dinghy, or who is known to lurk around as crew will be entered onto the league. There isn't an entry fee, which means there is no trophy either!!

Crews are awarded the same points as the helm. The result should be twofold: crews of Wayfarers and the like will get the credit they deserve; and boats with a good crew will have to work harder to keep them - in other words Hamish's beer bill will go up! If a helm goes off to crew for somebody else one week they will still get points. Those points will then go towards the series. That way somebody who helped a helm of a double hander is not penalised. That happened several times last year. For example, one Wednesday night Steven Darby (who normally competes in his own boat) crewed for Hamish. They came first but Steven was credited with not competing.

And finally, everyone knows about the 5 essentials of sailing, but there are 3 essentials of racing: one entrant, the race officer and safety cover. Since the spread of duty is not even, some series entrants are penalised more than others. The Sailing Committee have decided to try awarding average points to the OOD and Safety Boat crew if they are entrants in the points series. The hope is that this will spread the points and make participating more attractive, as well as providing more of a challenge to those who are most often at the top of the leader board.
